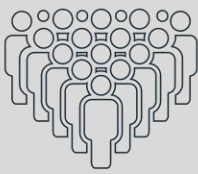

- ✓ The type of cookies

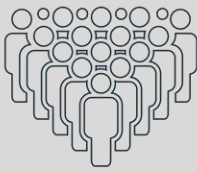

What are Cookies

Almost every website uses cookie technology. A cookie is a small file which a server downloads to your personal computer (PC) or mobile when you visit a website. When you next return to the site using the same device, your PC checks to see if it has a cookie that the website recognises. If it has such a cookie, it communicates with the website and enables the website to read the information held in that. This allows the site to recognise that the browser has been visited before and, in some cases, may alter the content shown to reflect this.

How to Control or Delete Cookies

If you would like to change how a browser uses cookies, including blocking or deleting cookies from the Trade360 website you can do so by changing the settings of your browser.

To control cookies, most browsers allow you to either accept or reject all cookies, only accept certain types of cookies, or prompt you every time a site wishes to save a cookie. It's also easy to delete cookies that are already saved on your device by a browser.

The processes for controlling and deleting cookies vary depending on which browser you use. To find out how to do so with a particular browser, you can use the Help function or alternatively, you can visit <http://www.aboutcookies.org> which explains, step-by-step, how to control and delete cookies in most browsers.

Type of Cookies

Strictly Necessary Cookies

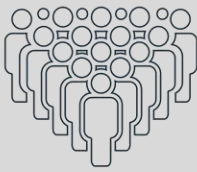
Some cookies are strictly necessary in order to enable you to move around the website and use its features. Without these cookies, you will not be able to do things like logging into your account.

Functionality Cookies

Functionality cookies record information about choices you've made and allow the website to remember choices you make. This could include your user name, language or the region you are in, and provide more enhanced and personal features.

Performance Cookies

Performance cookies collect information about how our client's use the website and are used for internal purposes to help us to provide you with a better user experience. These cookies do not collect information that can lead to an identification of the visitor of the website.

Targeting/Advertising Cookies

These cookies will usually be third-party cookies. These cookies are used to deliver adverts more relevant and suited to you and your interests. They're also used to limit the number of times you see an advertisement as well as help measure the effectiveness of the advertising campaign. They are usually placed by advertising networks with the website operator's permission.
